I am excited for our future and hope to see many of the barriers which school previously had, eradicated quickly and effectively.

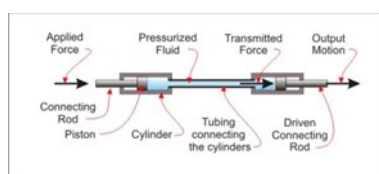

The Ultimate STEM Challenge begins again!

The next Ultimate STEM Challenge club begins Monday 5th June in F18 from 3.00 – 4.00pm for 6 weeks. This half terms challenge was developed by Dave Kaye from Cycle Fast and Debbie Lumb from Future Skills Academy. The challenge is to successfully design and build a simple pneumatic system.

The sessions are designed for Key Stage 3 students to tackle real-life pneumatics. By taking part in the challenge your child will develop transferrable skills that support their learning in other subject's e.g. effective communication, collaborative learning, team work and resilience. They will also improve their knowledge and understanding of STEM with a focus on Physics and hopefully be inspired to consider a future career in STEM. Most importantly they will enjoy the programme and achieve a feeling of success.

Driving in the school ground

Our student's safety is of paramount importance to the school.

As such, we sincerely hope that you will support our request to comply with the 5mph limit when driving in the school grounds.

The bus parking lanes are there for the use of buses only and not for cars. If you park in the bus lane, you are not only breaking the rules, but severely comprising the safety of students crossing, as their vision of travelling cars is impaired. Furthermore, they are stepping directly into the path of travelling cars.

Whilst we fully appreciate that if you hold a disabled badge you are entitled to park in a bay, we would respectfully request that if you are not getting out of your vehicle, that you park in the regular parking bays, freeing up priority for disabled students being collected.

Your support and co-operation is essential to ensure the safety of our students.
